Ms. Smith,

I hope this email finds you well and gets read at tonight's meeting. I really wanted to attend, but I had prior commitments that prevented me from attending.

I live at 421 Quail Ridge Rd and still stand by my comments from the last council meeting opposing this treatment plant.

At the last meeting, it was said that Willow Park doesn't want to enter into an agreement with a neighboring municipality on the sewage needs of Willow Park because Willow Park doesn't want to subject it's residents to another municipalities rate hikes. But Willow Park is willing to enter into an agreement with Fort Worth to have water brought in and be subject to rate hikes on the water. That doesn't make sense if you don't want subject residents to the rate hikes of another city.

Also, as said at the last meeting, Willow Park is not just Willow Park. It is part of a much larger community commonly referred to as just Aledo. That would include Willow Park, the 3 Annetta's, as well as Aledo proper itself. When you run into someone in town and they ask where you live, regardless of the actual city you live in, most people just say Aledo. We are a community that has always worked together.

I understand the need to figure out how to handle public infrastructure in light of the growth your individual city, as well as the entire Aledo community, is experiencing. That being said, if you go off on your own on this and don't try to be neighborly with the "community," I don't think it will go well in the future.

Maybe it would be a good idea to approach all the other municipalities and try to come up with a master plan for sewage whereby a cooperative is formed by all of the individual municipalities in the community to tackle this major issue and all participate in it together instead of individually. Otherwise we will eventually have a massive mess to deal with later on.

I truly hope we don't have to contest this legally and can work things out like neighbors by having a healthy, constructive dialogue. But that would require Willow Park to slow down and talk to its neighbors, which I don't think Willow Park cares to do.

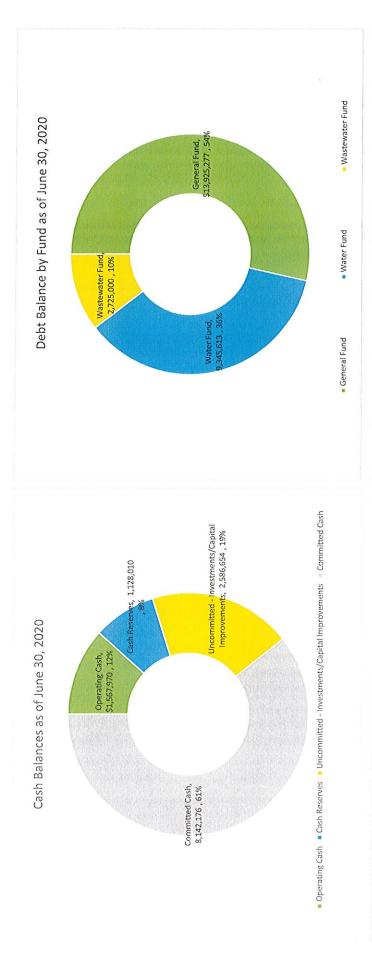

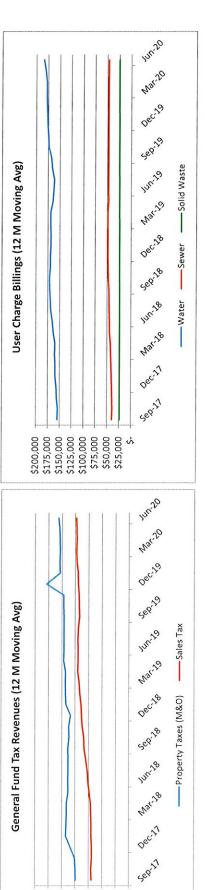
