AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOW PARK, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE DISANNEXATION FROM THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF WILLOW PARK, TEXAS, 11.69 ACRES SITUATED IN THE J. OZER SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 1029, PARKER COUNTY, TEXAS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 43.144 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE/REPEALER CLAUSE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Willow Park, Texas, has received a request from Bar-Ko Land Company, LLC ("Bar-Ko") to disannex a 11.69 acre tract of land, out of the J. OZER SURVEY, Abstract No. 1029, Parker County, Texas, with a situs of 8892 Bankhead Highway, the legal description of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (the "Property"), and said request was presented to the City Council on the 27th day of August, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Property was voluntarily annexed on the request of Bar-Ko on or about February 22, 2018 by the City pursuant to Ordinance 765-18;

WHEREAS, Bar-Ko and the City of Willow Park agree that the disannexation of the Property is voluntarily pursued by both parties and is not the result of a disputed service plan or any other obligation on the part of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Willow Park is not responsible for services to the Property nor reimbursement of property taxes paid during the time the Property was in the City limits; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 43.144 of the Texas Local Government Code, authorizes the disannexation of the Property; and

WHEREAS, after considering such request, attached hereto as Exhibit "B", the City Council has voted to grant such request and to disannex the Property from the City of Willow Park, Texas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOW PARK, TEXAS:

Section 1. Recitals Incorporated.

The recitals set forth above are incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Disannexation of the Property; repeal of service plan.

The City Council of the City of Willow Park hereby disannexes from the City limits the Property, which is described as 11.69 acres out of the J. OZER SURVEY, Abstract No. 1029,

Parker County, Texas, with a situs of 8892 Bankhead Highway, further described in attached Exhibit "A", which is incorporated herein and made a part of this ordinance. The Property shall upon disannexation be removed and discontinued from the City limits of the City of Willow Park, Texas.

The City Secretary is hereby directed to file with the County Clerk of Parker County, Texas a certified copy of this ordinance.

The service plan adopted with Ordinance 765-18 is hereby repealed and is no longer of any force and effect. By this ordinance, the City of Willow Park completes all service obligations described in said plan.

SECTION 3. Severability Clause.

If any word, section, article, phrase, paragraph, sentence, clause or portion of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect, for any reason, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance and the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Cumulative/Repealer Clause.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of State or Federal law and other ordinances of the City of Willow Park, Texas, whether codified or uncodified, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and publication, if

required by law.
